It was hard for Chester at first, because he didn't speak English. His high school teacher saw that Chester had a talent for kicking, and got him on the football team. Chester was a goalie on Poland's national junior team in soccer.

In college, he was a 4-time NAIA All-American. He played for Hillsdale College.

Chester has had some struggles in his life, but is working hard to overcome them.

He came to the Packers 30 years ago. In his rookie year he kicked 33 of 48 field goals,

team records that still stand. He also led the NFL in scoring and was named rookie of the year, and all-pro.

His biggest NFL game was against the Bears in the season opener at Lambeau Field. With the game in overtime, Chester Marcol was ready for a 34-yard field goal attempt to win the game. When he kicked the ball, it hit a Bear player's facemask, then, Marcol gets the ball back, and runs for a touchdown to win the game for the Green Bay Packers! After the game, coach Bart Starr gave the game ball to Chester. Chester Marcol was inducted into the Packers Hall Of Fame in 1987, an honor he greatly deserves.
